Your log for the previous day is automatically certified as soon as you make your first duty status change of the day. This certified log includes all the records entered the previous day.*

### NOTE

*The eDriver Logs<sup>+</sup> program allows drivers to split sleeper berth periods. It will automatically calculate sleeper berth totals by combining two sleeper berth periods that qualify according to the regulations that the driver is operating under.*

## CURRENT REGULATION

This option allows you to signal a border crossing into the U.S. Mainland, Alaska, California, Florida, Texas, Canada or Mexico. HOS are recalculated based on the country selected – except for Mexico. Each driver needs to submit their own border crossing entry.

## AUTOMATIC DUTY STATUS CHANGE

### (FOR SMART MODE USERS ONLY)

This option allows you or your co-driver to automatically switch between On Duty and Driving status. This requires stop and movement threshold configurations to be set by your Safety Manager. The automatic duty status changes are recorded from the start of each movement or stop event, not when the notification screen is displayed. The log entry for each duty status change includes the date, time, lat/long and distance from the nearest city.

### NOTE

If two drivers are logged into the eDriver Logs® program, the automatic duty status changes will record within the log of the last person in a Driving status.

When in an On Duty status and vehicle movement is detected beyond the distance threshold, a notification screen is displayed.

When in a Driving status and the vehicle is stopped for a greater length of time than the stop threshold, a notification screen is displayed.

The same rules apply when selecting **OK**, **CHANGE** or **SKIP**. In this case, **OK** places you in On Duty status.

## DRIVER PROMPTS

The eDriver Logs® system has many built-in warnings to help the driver avoid violations. In addition, when a Safety Manager enters a correction, the driver is notified with a new message. Select Review Log Sheets to view the corrections. They are indicated by an asterisk (\*).

A proactive warning is given to the driver one hour prior to running out of Driving or On Duty time. A second warning is given when the driver runs out of Driving or On Duty time.

The system will warn the driver if they are attempting to exit a Sleeper Berth or Off Duty status one hour before minimum requirements are met.



A proactive warning is given to a ferry boat driver before driving 25 km and invalidating a ferry boat event.

34-Hour Restart: This shows the driver when their next eligible 34-hour restart could start and end based on driver's previous history. The restart must include two periods from 1am - 5am and may only be used once per 168 hours, measured from the beginning of the previous restart; therefore the time may change and the driver will be updated. NOTE: When display says "Next" it is a future date and time that a valid restart will be available. When display says "Start" the break can be taken at any time.

Hours Available: This section displays available Driving, On Duty, and cycle time per regulation. It also shows the available time according to day and work shift rules, as well as available Defer time if you are eligible to defer.

Rules: Off Duty, Sleeper Berth, Driving, On Duty and total on duty time (Driving + On Duty) acquired in the current day. It also displays Driving and total on duty per the day, work shift and cycle regulations.

Cycle Reset: This displays the current off duty period (Off Duty and/or Sleeper Berth) counting towards your cycle reset.

Last and Next 24 Reset: This shows when the last 24 hour off duty period (Off Duty and/or Sleeper Berth) was, and when you next need to take one.

Hours Gained: This displays the number of hours gained at the end of the current day for the next day. It equals the hours used on day 1 of your cycle.

Off Duty Required: This is the total off duty time required for the day. It also displays the minimum consecutive off duty time (defer time + 8 hours) for day 2 when deferring. Additional off duty time is the daily required 2 hours of off duty not used to reset your work shift.

Split Sleeper & Defer: This section displays time spent in current and previous qualified Sleeper Berth periods. Also displayed is the amount of time used while deferring on day 1, the consecutive off duty period (Off Duty and/or Sleeper Berth) used on day 2, and the total qualifying off duty time on day 2.

Miles (km) Today: This shows the distance traveled on the current day.

Border Snapshot: This section displays the available time under your assigned US Mainland regulations.

## LOGOUT

This option allows you to log out of the program. This will suspend active logging under your name and ensures your Driver ID is not associated with other drivers' activities.

### NOTE

If you are **NOT** planning to return to the vehicle, you should select the "Remove your driver log from vehicle" option during the log out process. This returns your log to PeopleNet. When you retrieve this log again, the process may take a few minutes.

From the main menu, **SELECT LOGOUT**.

**NOTE:** For team drivers, make sure the correct user is selected before logging out.

**Arrow down** to the duty status you want to be in while logged out. Press **NEXT**. Driver ID and current duty status is displayed.

**NEXT** to confirm your location. If this is not your location, backspace to delete the location. Then use the keyboard to type the correct location.

**Enter any remarks** you want to appear in your log and press **DONE**.

Remarks are optional. You can skip this screen by selecting **DONE**.

**YES** to confirm your duty status and location.

**NO** to abort the log out process.

**NO if you will be returning to this vehicle and want to keep your driver log in the vehicle. Log out is complete. You will return to the main menu.**

## REVIEW LOG SHEETS

This option allows you to review or present to an officer during a roadside inspection the log detail for a single day including a daily HOS recap, company and terminal location, 24-hour period starting time, vehicle number and starting or ending odometer, trailer number, co-driver, time and location of each duty status change, miles traveled, override miles and co-driver prior to certification.

These options allow you to enter citation information or remarks that you want to appear in your log. Use the Remark option to add any additional notes you want to appear in your daily log such as weather or traffic delays.

This option is only available to drivers in Canada. It allows you to use Sleeper Berth time on and around qualifying ferry boat events to count towards a Work Shift reset. Each driver needs to submit their own Ferry Boat event. This information will appear in your log detail for the day.
